Yallambi

President provide update on Yallambi

- Price has dropped. "Unlimited" has been removed from "development potential" description
- No enquiries to Council
- With the overlays for wildlife habitat, waterways, flood plain, environmental significance, bushfire, landslip etc. and Powerlink corridor, a much reduced land area is available for subdivision into 6000 sq. m. blocks.
- Significant development costs access road upgrade, 2 bridges across 2 creeks capable of carrying trucks, heavy machinery, land clearing, connection of power and water
- May not be attractive to developers
- BRA will adopt a "wait and see" stance

Cr Matt Constance spoke regarding the possible development of Yallambi

- 11 overlays of the site presented
- Questions from the floor and ensuring discussion
- Wilga / Windarra cannot compare to Yallambi due to the changes in planning schemes in the years since the Wilag / Windarra development.
- Lessons learnt from Wilga / Windarra by BRA and MBRC, e.g. use of property notes, not covenant to enforce land clearing restrictions.
- Overlays v covenants discussion
- Council must by law accept all development proposals submitted. Acceptance of a proposal is not approval.
- Cr Constance will advise BRA if a development p[roposal is submitted, and provide guidance in regard to the process to be followed to lodge objections.

Bushcare & Old Bunya School

- Cr Matt Constance attended our last Bushcare day and even though it was a small turnout we did a fair bit of lantana clearing on the far side of the creek
- No problem crossing as the creek is dry. Many of the plants we have planted are doing well but with the lack of rain a number have been lost
- Our next Bushcare day will be the 14th March 2020
- Had hoped to have the Archaeological and Management plan to present tonight but draft arrived late this afternoon (27/11) and as it is 69 pages haven't had time to read it yet
- It will be e-mailed to the committee for comment
- Brian has a list of everyone who has participated in any activities at Old Bunya School if ever needed to bring everyone together to celebrate/recognise

- We have had lots of changes over the 25 years with many residents having served on the committee. An
 important change when we ceased hand delivered newsletters and commenced using the e-mail list of
 over 280 families—getting out information so quickly or so we thought but then our facebook page with
 870 current followers. Thanks to Shaun Riggien our website has recently had more upgrades to make it

- Many dogs and other animals have been found and returned to their homes quickly with both e-mail and facebook. When a resident asks for information, help or advice I am always heartened to know so many helpful replies come in
- The community coming together has resulted in a few very big wins
 - o Blue Hills Drive remaining a No Through Road when the Windarra estate was developed
 - The Windarra development--with the support of the Council and the many residents who put in their objections, so much extra vegetation was retained and also the important animal corridors put in place
 - o All Bunya properties having their Land Valuations re-assessed--this was an unprecedented result

- All these results were achieved by the community coming together for the betterment of all. Together we can achieve great results
- Our next challenge will be the possible development of Yallambi and as we have learnt so much from the Windarra development we will be there to push for the best results possible for Bunya residents. It is therefore important to have as many residents as possible join the BRA as members because this gives us more credibility when we approach the Council on behalf of the residents

 Matt Constance is always there giving us his full support. We have had support from many Councillors over
